

*lucky pennymake Lime Pincushion Pattern*  
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*Materials* ~ Yarn: Single strand of Paton's Classic Wool Merino in Leaf Green ~ Stuffing: Wool yarn bits and pieces ~ Needles: #9 DPNs ~ 1 package of Lemon-Lime kool-aid (optional)

Cast-on 5 and join in the round.

- Rnds 1 & 2: Knit
- Rnd 3: Inc around (10 sts)
- Rnd 4: (Inc, K1) around (15 sts)
- Rnd 5: (Inc, K2) around (20 sts)
- Rnd 6: (Inc, K3) around (25 sts)
- Rnds 6-12: Knit (piece should measure about 2")
- Rnd 13: (K2tog, K3) around (20 sts)
- Rnd 14: (K2tog, K2) around (15 sts)
- Rnd 15: (K2tog, K1) around (10 sts)
- At this point you should stuff the lime. I stuffed it pretty full, knowing that the stuffing would felt too.
- Rnd 16: K2tog around (5 sts)
- Rnds 17 & 18: Knit



Finish off by cutting yarn and pulling through the remaining five stitches. Weave in ends.

### *Leaf*

*Materials*~Yarn: Single strand of Cascade 220 ~ Needles: #9 DPNs

- Cast-on 4 sts
- Row 1-5: Knit as for an i-cord.
- Row 6: K1, M1, K2, M1, K1
- Row 7 and all remain odd numbered rows: Knit across
- Row 9: K1, M1, K4, M1, K1
- Rows 11: Knit
- Row 13: K1, K2 tog, k2, k2tog, k1
- Row 15: K1, K2tog 2X, K1
- Row 17: K2tog 2X
- Row 19: K2tog

Finish off and weave in ends.

Felt the lime and leaf. Check frequently as the leaf probably won't take as long to felt as the lime.



To dye the lime a deep green.

Pour four cups of water into a microwave safe dish. Add 1 package of Lemon/lime Kool-aid and microwave for several minutes (until boiling or nearly). Add the lime and stir again. Microwave for 5 more minutes and then leave lime in water, stirring occasionally until all dye is taken up or lime is a deep green color. Squeeze excess water out and let lime dry completely.

Once lime and leaf are dry add an i-cord stem or a crochet stem.

*I-cord stem.* Cast-on three stitches and knit as for an i-cord for 1.5 inches. Use end to attach stem to lime. Attach leaf halfway up stem with waste yarn.

*Crochet chain stem.* Chain 1.5 inches. Turn and single crochet across. Proceed as for i-cord stem.

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
